WHERE OUR FOOD COMES FROM



WHERE OUR FOOD GOES

Total pounds distributed: 431,626



At **PRESTON'S PANTRY**, shoppers can enjoy a variety of fresh fruits and vegetables, shelf stable items, and pantry staples. The pantry served 4,734 (duplicated) households this year, a 22% increase over last year.



ENERGENCY FOOD CLOSETS provide shelf stable pantry items for residents facing an unexpected shortage of food. In 2018-19, Lift UP stocked the equivalent of 45,000 meals in 26 Emergency Food Closets in our service area.




DELIVERED FOOD BOXES contain one week's worth of meals and can be customized to meet residents' dietary restrictions, such as Diabetic or Low Sodium. 3,168 were received by residents in 2018-19, 42% more than the previous year.



SUPPER CLUB, our healthy eating workshops teach culinary skills, provide the nutritional info about of food Lift UP provides through our programs, and encourage community building among residents. In 2018-19, attendance increased 130%, to 442 participants.
